Over this first 100 kilometres, the river drops in fabulous grade I and II rapids. We will get a chance to see the Thirteen Steps and the Wildmint Hot Springs. We then join the Nahanni just downstream of Hell's Gate and continue through Nahanni Ntl Park. This trip is for paddlers who seek some real wilderness in Nahanni Ntl. Park. Skill Level 2.

# CANOEING RIVERS

## Hood River

The Arctic's most spectacular Barren's river stretches north with exciting rapids & paddling. Muskox graze and Barrenlands caribou migrate, allowing amazing wildlife viewing. Peregrine Falcons, golden eagles and gyrfalcons grace the sky. The midnight sun entices us to explore long into the evening. Finally, the Hood plunges over Wilberforce Falls twice the height of Niagara! Skill Level 2+.

## Coppermine River

Caribou, great Arctic Char fishing and moderate whitewater make this a great trip! Skill Level 2.

## Natla-Keele River

The Natla/Keele watershed starts high in the MacKenzie Mountains at O'Grady Lake. The Natla drops over 2000' in 200 km of swifts and rapids, very similar to the Nahanni's Rock Gardens. This section of the river is appropriate for the advanced whitewater canoeist. After joining the Keele, the river flows over 300 km, traversing some of the most beautiful ranges of the Mackenzie Mountains. Caribou, grizzly, dall sheep and wolf call it home. Paddling is excellent - lots of easy, runnable rapids make this stretch fun for any canoeist! Skill Level 3(Natla), Level 1+ (Keele)

## Horton River

The Horton River is one of the most remote rivers in the Northwest Territories. An abundance of wildlife can be seen along its shores: caribou, muskoxen, wolves, grizzlies and over 80 species of birds. The clear, swift-flowing river has only a few major rapids, found primarily in the three canyons. This is an exceptional wilderness trip with easy paddling, great hiking and barrens scenery. 3 wks from Horton Lake. Skill Level 2.

## Snake River

The beautiful Snake River runs over 300 kilometres through the Yukon's northern mountains. Isolated and remote, from its headwaters at Duo Lakes it flows north along the NWT's border. An assortment of fun, grade I and II rapids stretch between gravel bars decorated with fireweed. Fantastic hiking, runnable rapids and remote wilderness make this a treat for any keen paddler. Skill Level 2.

## Stone Knife exploratory

The Stone Knife River is a tributary of the Mountain River, buried deep in the craggy ridges of the Mackenzie Mountains. We'll trace this river from Shale Lake to its confluence with the Mountain River, just downstream of the Mountain's 2nd Canyon. As this is a 'first run', we are unable to describe the rapids and river course exactly, however, the scenery is dramatic and promises a great adventure. This trip is appropriate for the advanced paddler. Skill 3.

Early Indian tribes paddled this river to hunt and fish, and in recent history, log drives echoed from its shores. We design this trip with time for instruction and coaching in all whitewater techniques. Skill Level I+.

The Noire River is a beautiful river, which flows from its headwaters at Lac Coughlin in Quebec into the Ottawa River near Deep River, Ontario. Compared with the Dumoine River, the Noire has the highest total running length of rapids, lowest distance of portages, the best opportunities to view wildlife and the lowest river traffic. Our 7 Day Noire trip is designed to provide coaching in whitewater skills and safety while having an enjoyable holiday descending the river. We start at Lac Patrice and paddle approximately 110 km to our take out at the Black River Inn. Skill Level 1+.

## Mongolia - Chuluut River

Experience the thrill of paddling a whitewater river that few Westerners have even seen! The Chuluut River races through the canyons and steppes of central Mongolia. This expedition includes seven days of paddling, plus visits to ancient Kharakhorum (once the capital city of Genghis Khan) and to the mountain forests of Gorki-Terelji National Park. Paddlers with intermediate-level whitewater skills will enjoy running Mongolia's rapids in our SOAR canoes (very high grade inflatable boats). Skill Level 1+.

## Green River, Utah

From here the river is wide and fast, flowing majestically through 300 km of some of the north's most beautiful mountains. Here the paddling is fun with constant current and lots of easy rapids. This trip will be a combination of participants in either traditional canoes or SOAR canoes. You can choose to paddle the Natla, the Keele or both sections. Skill Level 2 - Natla, Skill Level 1 - Keele.

## Scorebysund Greenland

Far above the arctic circle, a huge fjord system cuts into the east coast of Greenland toward the inland ice. Flanked by steep mountains, this area is home to muskox, narwhals and seals. The remains of past civilizations of Greenlandic Inuit peoples are seen as tent rings or stone walls. We access this remote area by charter aircraft and will spend 2 weeks exploring. As well as kayaking, day hikes are spectacular. The fjords are protected, making this is an excellent trip for the intermediate paddler or seasoned adventurer. Skill Level 2.

## Pond Inlet - In Search of the Narwal

At this time we will spend two weeks exploring the coasts of Eclipse Sound, Milne Inlet and Navy Board Inlet, watching for the ever-elusive narwhal. Skill Level 3.

## Ellesmere Getaway

Our one week hike in Ellesmere Island National Park will be in the Hazen Lake area. This area is known as a thermal oasis - the Grant Mountains in the north shelter the Hazen valley from the arctic winds. This attracts wildlife and provides a rich environment for arctic wildflowers. The area saw migrations of the Thule and Dorset Inuit, forefathers of the present day Inuit of Nunavut. Our trek begins at the Hazen Lake research station and will journey by the Henrietta Nasmith Glacier on a circuit, returning back to Hazen. Skill Level 1+.

## Devon Island

Nunavut's Devon Island is a rugged wilderness of soaring plateaus covered by thick icecaps, rich lowlands and ringed by arctic waters teeming with life. We will start our expedition in the Truelove Lowlands, home of herds of muskoxen and arctic fox. Heading inland, we trek into the highlands, by glaciers and huge waterfalls. We'll circle back by the north shore towards the Svedrup Lowlands, looking for the remains of the historic Svedrup explorations, as the North was being opened up. We'll see ancient ruins of Thule sites, dating back hundreds of years. Skill Level 2.

## South Greenland Hike

Our trek is planned to hike from the community of Qaqortoq to Narsarsuaq. This route passes the ruins of Hvalsey, the first Christian church built in 986 AD, as well, we will explore the homestead of Eric the Red. We will have boat transfers to cross fjords. Skill Level 2.

## Arctic Iceland

This exploratory trip will be in the remote fjords and headlands of northwest Iceland. In this region there is a peninsula of land that no roads reach and is no longer inhabited. It is located at the Arctic circle and reaches out towards Greenland in the Arctic Ocean. The area has a rich cultural history since its shores were first landed upon by Viking ships in the 900's. It is truly one of the "last places" at the furthest reaches of Iceland. The trip will include exploring the unique Icelandic culture and environment. Skill Level 2.
